
A day in the life of... Tori Wilson

Jamie is an **Graduate Electro-Mechanical Engineer**. He collaborates with various managers and engineers within the company, providing assistance to the technical project team.


Jamie says "The working environment at CLdN is dynamic and fast-paced. My experience has been extremely positive, fostering the development of strong relationships with my colleagues.

Max is in the first year of a three-year **Plate Welding Apprenticeship**. He typically works with a team of welders, fitters, car mechanics and other apprentices.


Max explains the work he's doing at the moment: "One of the larger projects I have been working on is doing mechanical and structural work on a skelly. I fully stripped it down and replaced some mechanical components. I then carefully removed some support beams on the inside, without damaging the rest of the framework. After some preparation, I put the new pieces of support beams back into their original place and did some small welds around the beam. Once I had double checked everything was in the right place I proceeded to fully weld the piece.

"The day always ends by tidying away all tools and equipment I had been using and making sure the walkways and the area surrounding my job are free from any obstructions and hazards."

Mollie is currently in the first year of her **Business Administration apprenticeship** and her role involves collaborating closely with a team of Customer Service administrators and automotive staff.
